In Memoriam: Dr. Kenneth W. Street



The Austin College community lost a legendary professor December 6, with the death of Dr. Kenneth Street, 90, professor emeritus of political science. Dr. Street spent nearly 40 years preparing young men and women for careers in law and government during an Austin College career that included teaching on many topics, with special emphasis on Constitutional law, the presidency, the legislative process, political parties, and political theory.

Advocacy Program Sets Up for Kangaroo Brawl

The Austin College Advocacy Program will host the first Kangaroo Brawl on January 20-21. "I am really proud of all that our students have accomplished in competition," said attorney Ed Richardson '95, coach for the Austin College Advocacy Program. "Our success is evidence of the legacy of Dr. Kenneth Street, and we will dedicate this tournament here in his courtroom to his memory."

The Mock Trial tournament, which will be held at Austin College, is sponsored by Texas Tech Law School and is limited to 24 teams. Awards will go to the top five teams and top 10 witnesses and advocates. Each member of the top two teams will receive a \$5,000 scholarship to Texas Tech Law School.
