



ASSISTANT PROFESSOR OF PSYCHOLOGY (CLINICAL OR COUNSELING)

Austin College's [Department of Psychology](#) invites applications for a tenure-track assistant professor position in Clinical or Counseling Psychology, beginning August 2022. Area of specialization is open.

We are particularly interested in candidates who teach and practice evidence-based therapy techniques. The successful candidate will work with existing faculty to develop a sustainable clinical/counseling track within the psychology major, including a practicum experience for students. Candidates are expected to have a Ph.D. conferred by August 2022.

A strong commitment to teaching excellence is essential. The successful candidates can expect to teach Psychopathology, courses on psychotherapy and/or assessment, and upper-level courses in their areas of specialization. The ability to teach a subset of service courses for the department is highly desirable (e.g., General Psychology, Statistics for Psychologists, and/or Quantitative Research Methods). Our department supports a range of collaborative research and internship opportunities for undergraduates. We welcome applicants who are excited about conducting research with undergraduate students and placing students into internships in the surrounding community. We appreciate candidates who can work with and/or contribute to interdisciplinary programs or courses, such as in Public Health, East Asian Studies, Gender Studies, Nonprofit Organizations and Public Service, or Southwestern and Mexican Studies.
