The Fulbright Program is the flagship international educational exchange program of the United States. These awardees represent the United States as cultural ambassadors helping to enhance mutual understanding between Americans and the people of the world. More than 100,000 Fulbright U.S. Student Program alumni have undertaken grants since the program began in 1948. This year, the Fulbright U.S. Student Program received over 10,000 applications.
